

The classroom teacher is at the centre of your child's learning team and is supported by a school learning team. Based on classroom needs, each kindergarten program will also be supported by a multidisciplinary team that works with large and small groups in the classroom.

Psychologists
Occupational Therapists (OTs)
Physiotherapists (PTs)
School Family Liaison (SFL)

Getting Ready for Kindergarten





Build your child's independence by encouraging them to:





- dress themselves (zippers, buttons)
- use the bathroom and wash their hands on their own
- put away toys and assist in other small ways at home
- practice opening and closing snack containers and using a water bottle (have a picnic at home!)
- play games, take turns and compromise
- develop a consistent bedtime routine




Getting Ready for Kindergarten





Read to your child every day:







- •enjoy reading different types of books: picture books, information books, nursery rhymes, poetry
- •encourage your child to talk about the pictures and stories as you read together
- visit your community library (when possible)

Getting Ready for Kindergarten






Take time to talk with your child about everyday activities:



- share special activities together, such as walks to the park
- talk about what you are seeing and doing
- talk, read, sing and play in your first language every day
- praise children for their efforts and courage to overcome setbacks
- talk about how it is okay to make mistakes



First Days of Kindergarten









For the first day of classes, and every day that follows, please be sure to send your child to school with:

- A <u>backpack</u> large enough to hold a library book, a 'Home and Back' folder, a lunch bag and a water bottle.
- Healthy snack: If your child is attending before or after school care,
 please pack the snack for school in a separate container/box
- Indoor <u>running shoes</u> with Velcro fasteners (shoes will be left at school) that your child can put on and take off independently
- If you child brings shoes with laces, please ensure they can tie them independently.
- Items for the <u>weather</u> (ie. hats, mittens).
- Clothing that is appropriate for <u>playing</u>, <u>creating</u> and <u>exploring</u>!
- Spare set of clothing (socks, pants, shirt, undergarments)



Transportation | Busing









Morning kindergarten program, you may be eligible for your child to ride the bus to school in the morning. Please note that you will need to arrange for your child to be picked up at the end of the kindergarten morning.

Afternoon kindergarten program, you may be eligible for your child to ride the bus home from school at the end of the day. Please note that you will need to arrange for your child to get to school at the beginning of the afternoon.

For kindergarten, only one way busing is available.

Pick-Up and Drop-Off Procedures









Students will be dropped off and picked up at the kindergarten doors. Students will be will dismissed to parents/caregivers. On the days you have to make alternative arrangements for your child to be picked up, please inform the office and your child's teacher.

For those students arriving/departing by bus transportation, there will be an adult to greet your child each day and they will be accompanied to the kindergarten door for the first part of the year. At the end of the day, students will be accompanied and supervised as they load onto their departing busses.

If your child is late for school, please check in at the office.

If your child is going to be away, please email battalionpark@cbe.ab.ca as well as your child's teacher.

Follow these steps to access your **MyCBE account**. You will need your child's **CBE Student ID number** (available in the school office) to begin the process of activating your account.



Step 1: Click on Create a MyCBE Account

Go to: http://www.cbe.ab.ca/mycbe and click the *Create a MyCBE Account*.

Step 2: Create Parent / Legal Guardian Account



Click the **Parent Legal Guardian** tab, if you are creating an account to access information about your children in MyCBE

Review the information on the page.

To create a MyCBE account, you must agree to the <u>Terms and Conditions</u>. To activate the create account button:

Check the box in front of: *I agree and acknowledge the terms and conditions of a MyCBE account*. Click the **Create Parent / Legal Guardian Account** button to continue.





Complete the Parent Account Form

Enter the information in the appropriate boxes. For Email, enter your email address that is on file at the school.





To create an account you must link to at least one of your children.

The child must be currently enrolled or pre-registered in a CBE school or you will not be able to create an account.



Student First Name: Child's legal first name on file at the school Student Last Name: Child's legal last name on file at the school **CBE Student ID:** Student ID Number (available at the school office)

Date of Birth: Child's date of birth



Then click **Submit** near the bottom of the page.

Step 3: Verify the Email Address and Sign In

Verify your email and sign in to access your new account. You will receive a verification email to the email address you provided.





If you do not get a verification email, the email on file at the school may be different from what you used to create the account.



Click on the verification link in that email within 24 hours to finish setting up your account.



When you click on the email link, you'll see a verification screen with a congratulations message and be able to sign into your new account. Enter the username and password you chose and click **Sign In** to access your new account.


